

My early partners and I identified a sector with opportunity. We took on mismanaged garden-style apartment complexes, improved them, and in the process created nicer homes for tenants while also creating profit for our company. Some of my partners moved on to try their hand at other types of real estate, but I stayed focused on the low-rise apartment market. My formula was working, and I saw opportunities to take it further with new partners. It was a good decision; that business is still thriving nearly 60 years later.

I approach philanthropy the same way. I believe in developing a few strong ideas to derive broad impact and taking them further with partners who share my passion for making a difference in the Jewish community. A Focused Approach to Philanthropy

The Harold Grinspoon Foundation supports a vibrant Jewish community. We do this by focusing on a few select projects and continually evaluating whether they are creating more connected and engaged Jewish families.

A benefit of this approach is that we get to know a lot about our chosen sectors. By connecting with professionals in the field, we learn how those Jewish organizations operate. We develop a better understanding of where challenges and opportunities exist to engage families at particular life stages. We cultivate relationships with other funders in the field. By concentrating our time and funding in certain areas, we find opportunities to make our dollars go further.

When the pandemic threatened the future of Jewish summer camp, our years of work with camps positioned us to mobilize an immediate and effective response. We structured a challenge grant - All Together Now - in ways that worked best for camps at that critical moment, working closely with camp professionals and lay leaders at

each step. This partnership helped to leverage our challenge grant to raise additional funding; in a matter of months, thousands of supporters came together to contribute millions of dollars to help sustain camps during a difficult time. In our view, this is a prime example of impactful philanthropy.

The numbers that truly count, of course, are the many people we hope to support: a generation of youngsters building lasting friendships at Jewish summer camps, families around the world receiving PJ Library books and building closer ties to Jewish culture and traditions, and future generations who will enjoy flourishing Jewish community life because of the endowments that are built today.

I am pleased to share this financial report with you. The numbers show how a focused approach to philanthropy continues to achieve measurable, meaningful results for the Jewish community.



Essential Gifts, Immeasurable Impact

PJ Library Alliance

The PJ Library Alliance is a collective of leading funders who commit at least \$1 million to support PJ Library's work engaging Jewish children and families through meaningful Jewish stories.

Together with the HGF, the PJ Library Alliance provides a funding backbone for PJ Library, propelling the growth needed to reach new families and spurring the innovation that expands and enhances PJ Library's offerings and deepens impact. To date, PJ Library Alliance partners have collectively pledged more than \$50 million, making the expansion of PJ Library possible and building a program that extends far beyond the books and more deeply into the fabric of the global Jewish community, starting at its roots: in the home.

Support from PJ Library Alliance partners is instrumental in advancing core PJ Library goals:

GROW BOLDLY, aiming to reach 300,000 Jewish children and their families outside of Israel.

PUT PARENTS AT THE CENTER, activating parents to be leaders of Jewish exploration and engagement in their homes and communities.

INVEST IN CONTENT AND CONTENT CREATORS, enhancing content quality and growing the diversity and representation of Jews from different backgrounds within the Jewish books and resources that PJ Library sends to families.

A Bridge to a Brighter Future

PJ Library Endowment

The PJ Library endowment program was launched in spring 2021 to ensure that PJ Library will be financially sustainable in Jewish communities. The endowment program is a two-year fundraising initiative that offers matching funds to inspire both legacy and cash gifts for building a PJ Library endowment fund in participating communities. Nine communities were selected to participate in the first two-year pilot program. The match is producing positive results: In the first quarter, funders committed more than \$2 million in cash endowment funds to support the PJ Library programs in their local communities.

Keren Grinspoon Israel®

Keren Grinspoon Israel (KGI) focuses on literacy through the gift of books to young children in Israel. KGI partners with the Israeli Ministry of Education and other partners to distribute books in Hebrew and Arabic to children in Israeli public schools through its two programs: Sifriyat Pijama and Maktabat al-Fanoos.

Sifriyat Pijama™

Sifriyat Pijama ("Pajama Library" in Hebrew) is the Israeli version of PJ Library. The program aims to strengthen children's Jewish identity and foster a love of reading by providing high-quality Hebrew picture books in classrooms from preschool through second grade. Once they have read the books in the classroom and explored the content, children take the books home to keep and share with their families, leading to meaningful conversations about Jewish heritage, culture, and values.

Maktabat al-Fanoos™

Maktabat al-Fanoos (Arabic for "Lantern Library") is a classroom-based literacy program for all young children in public Arab-Israeli schools from preschool through second grade. Students explore the books with their teachers in class and then take them home to own and enjoy again and again with their families. This helps children develop emotional awareness, language skills, and knowledge of Arab history and culture while also fostering a love of reading.

JCamp 180®

JCamp 180 focuses on the sustainability and organizational effectiveness of nonprofit Jewish camps through training for lay and professional leaders on strategic planning, fundraising, and governance.

More than 140 overnight and day camps in the US and Canada receive support via JCamp 180's matching grants, conferences, consulting services, coaching, professional development, resources, and research.

Over the past two years, the HGF and its partners have committed more than \$20 million in new All Together Now matching grant dollars to address the camps' immediate financial needs resulting from the COVID-19 crisis. To date, these matching funds have leveraged more than 32,000 donations to camps, bringing our combined total investment to over \$57 million.



All Together Now

All Together Now 2020

By the conclusion of the All Together Now 2020 grant, the HGF's \$10 million commitment catalyzed thousands of donors to contribute \$16 million to participating overnight camps.

The HGF focused on getting resources to the camp community when the 2020 summer season was still uncertain. By making this significant commitment so early, the All Together Now 2020 grant created a wave of confidence across the field by providing unrestricted grant dollars so that camps could deploy the money where they needed it most. Camps also received wraparound support, including webinars and online tools, to help them succeed along the way.

All Together Now 2021

Building on the success of the All Together Now 2020 grant and in recognition of the ongoing financial needs in the field, the HGF announced the All Together Now 2021 grant in early February 2021. Funding for this matching grant comes from the HGF, an anonymous donor, and additional support from the Klaff Family Foundation, the Franco family, and other generous donors. In total, throughout 2021, the HGF allocated nearly \$10.4 million for the overnight Jewish camps associated with JCamp 180.



Giving Today, Growing the Future

Life & Legacy®

Life & Legacy focuses on securing a bright Jewish future for the next generation and beyond through legacy gifts that sustain Jewish organizations. By providing training, support, and monetary incentives, Life & Legacy supports Jewish communities in the US and Canada as they build endowments, secure legacy gifts, steward donors, and integrate legacy giving into the philanthropic culture of the Jewish community. To date, the program has secured an incredible result, with a \$22 million investment catalyzing over \$1.2 billion in additional growth.
